Summary (as of Jul 18, 2019)

Stopping Aggressive Incursions on Liberty by Ordering Russian Sanctions Act or the SAILORS Act

This bill directs the President to impose visa- and asset-blocking sanctions on a certain number of senior officers of Russia's Border Service or Federal Security Service, as well as on the families and close associates of such officers. The sanctions shall terminate when the President certifies to Congress that Russia has released the Ukrainian ships and sailors it had seized on November 25, 2018, in the Kerch Strait.

Actions Timeline

- **Aug 12, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Immigration and Citizenship.
- **Jul 18, 2019:** Introduced in House
- **Jul 18, 2019:** Sponsor introductory remarks on measure. (CR E943)
- **Jul 18, 2019:** Referred to the Committee on Foreign Affairs, and in addition to the Committee on the Judiciary, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
