This resolution sets forth the rule for consideration of H.R. 1500 (Consumers First Act) and H.R. 1994 (Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act of 2019).

Certain proceedings may take place on any legislative day from May 24, 2019, through May 31, 2019.

It shall be in order at any time on the legislative day of May 23, 2019, for the Speaker of the House to suspend the rules, relating to a measure making supplemental appropriations for FY2019.

The resolution waives a specified requirement of Rule XIII (Calendar and Committee Reports) to allow consideration of any resolution reported from the Committee on Rules through such legislative day, on the same day it is presented to the House, relating to such measure.

The House Committee on Appropriations may, at any time before 5:00 p.m. on Sunday, June 2, 2019, file privileged reports to accompany measures making appropriations for FY2020.

Actions Timeline

- **May 21, 2019:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H4024-4030)
- **May 21, 2019:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 389.
- **May 21, 2019:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - At the conclusion of debate on H. Res. 389, the Chair put the question on ordering the previous question, and by voice vote, announced that the ayes had prevailed. Mr. Woodall demanded the yeas and nays and the Chair postponed further proceedings on the question of ordering the previous question until later in the legislative day.
- **May 21, 2019:** Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H4030-4031)
- **May 21, 2019:** On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 227 - 191 (Roll no. 220). (consideration: CR H4030)
- **May 21, 2019:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 230 - 190 (Roll no. 221).(text: CR H4024-4025)
- **May 21, 2019:** On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 230 - 190 (Roll no. 221). (text: CR H4024-4025)
- **May 21, 2019:** Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
- **May 20, 2019:** Introduced in House
- **May 20, 2019:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 116-79, by Mr. Perlmutter.
- **May 20, 2019:** The resolution provides for one hour of debate on H.R. 1500, under a structured rule, and provides for one hour of debate on H.R. 1994, under a closed rule. The resolution provides for proceedings during the period from May 24, 2019, through May 31, 2019, and provides for motions to suspend the rules on the legislative day of May 23, 2019.
