FISA Reform Act of 2019

This bill requires periodic reports to Congress about surveillance conducted under the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act to include the identity of any individual targeted for surveillance who is associated with a candidate for President of a major party.

Actions Timeline

- **Aug 15, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Crime, Terrorism, and Homeland Security.
- **Jul 25, 2019:** Introduced in House
- **Jul 25, 2019:** Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, and in addition to the Committee on Intelligence (Permanent Select), for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
