Super Pollutants Act of 2019

This bill generally provides for the reduction of emissions of black carbon, methane, and certain hydrofluorocarbons (also referred to as short-lived climate pollutants) through policy initiatives of specified federal agencies. The bill also requires the President to establish the Interagency Task Force on Short-Lived Climate Pollutant Mitigation.

Actions Timeline

- **Aug 5, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Environment and Climate Change.
- **Aug 2, 2019:** Introduced in House
- **Aug 2, 2019:** Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committees on Foreign Affairs, and Financial Services, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
