Summary (as of Dec 14, 2020)

PPE Supply Chain Transparency Act of 2020

This bill requires the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to issue, within 90 days, a public report on the security and resilience of the supply chain for personal protective equipment during the COVID-19 (i.e., coronavirus disease 2019) pandemic. This equipment includes face masks, protective clothing, and other supplies designed to protect the wearer from injury or infection.

Actions Timeline

- **Dec 14, 2020:** Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs. Reported by Senator Johnson with amendments and an amendment to the title. With written report No. 116-319.
- **Dec 14, 2020:** Placed on Senate Legislative Calendar under General Orders. Calendar No. 622.
- **Jul 22, 2020:** Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs. Ordered to be reported with amendments favorably.
- **Jul 2, 2020:** Introduced in Senate
- **Jul 2, 2020:** Read twice and referred to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs.

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
