## **Providing Recovery Opportunities & Mitigating Industry's Shifting Economics (PROMISE) Act**

This bill addresses providing resources to communities affected by the closure of a federally-owned electric generating station.

Among other things, the bill

- authorizes the Department of the Interior to conduct land reuse studies in connection with the closure of an electric generating station to determine the next best use of the property;
- provides for a demonstration project to assist dislocated workers;
- allows Interior to provide annual payments to a state, tribal, or local government for loss of revenues due to the closing of an electric generating facility; and
- establishes a Significantly Impacted Federal Community Economic Adjustment Program to assist substantially and seriously affected communities, businesses, and workers from the effects of energy infrastructure closures.

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- **Sep 23, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee for Indigenous Peoples of the United States.
- **Sep 23, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Energy and Mineral Resources.
- **Sep 23, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests, and Public Lands.
- **Sep 12, 2019:** Introduced in House
- **Sep 12, 2019:** Referred to the Committee on Natural Resources, and in addition to the Committee on Education and Labor, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
