### Summary (as of Sep 12, 2019)

### Marijuana 1-to-3 Act of 2019

This bill directs the Drug Enforcement Administration to transfer marijuana from schedule I to schedule III of the Controlled Substances Act. (A schedule I controlled substance is a drug, substance, or chemical that has a high potential for abuse; that has no currently accepted medical use; and that is subject to regulatory controls and administrative, civil, and criminal penalties under the Controlled Substances Act. A schedule III controlled substance is a drug, substance, or chemical that has less potential for abuse than a schedule I or II substance; that has a currently accepted medical use; and that has low or moderate risk of dependence if abused.)

## Actions Timeline

- **Oct 2, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Crime, Terrorism, and Homeland Security.
- **Sep 13, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Sep 12, 2019:** Introduced in House
- **Sep 12, 2019:** Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on the Judiciary, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
