Quell Underage Inhaling of Toxic Substances Act of 2019 or the QUITs Act of 2019

This bill increases the excise tax on various tobacco products and prohibits the flavoring of certain tobacco products.

Actions Timeline

- **Sep 20, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Sep 19, 2019:** Introduced in House
- **Sep 19, 2019:** Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on Ways and Means, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
