National POW/MIA Memorial and Museum Act of 2019

This bill designates the memorial and museum that is being constructed on an approximately 26-acre area on the POW-MIA Memorial Parkway in Jacksonville, Florida, as the "National POW/MIA Memorial and Museum."

The director of the memorial and museum shall submit a report to Congress that includes a budget for the memorial and museum.

Actions Timeline

- **Oct 2, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Disability Assistance and Memorial Affairs.
- **Oct 2, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests, and Public Lands.
- **Sep 20, 2019:** Introduced in House
- **Sep 20, 2019:** Referred to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs, and in addition to the Committee on Natural Resources, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
