Pathways to Improving Homeland Security at the Local Level Act

This bill requires the Department of Homeland Security's Office for State and Local Law Enforcement to produce and disseminate an annual catalog of training opportunities, programs, and services that are available to state, local, and tribal law enforcement agencies.

Actions Timeline

- **Jan 29, 2019:** Miss Rice (NY) moved to suspend the rules and pass the bill.
- **Jan 29, 2019:** Considered under suspension of the rules. (consideration: CR H1260-1261)
- **Jan 29, 2019:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H.R. 449.
- **Jan 29, 2019:** At the conclusion of debate, the Yeas and Nays were demanded and ordered. Pursuant to the provisions of clause 8, rule XX, the Chair announced that further proceedings on the motion would be postponed.
- **Jan 29, 2019:** Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H1268)

- **Jan 10, 2019:** Referred to the Committee on Homeland Security, and in addition to the Committee on the Judiciary, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
