Community Broadband Mapping Act

This bill authorizes the Department of Agriculture's Rural Utilities Service to award telecommunications grants to local governments, electric and telephone cooperatives, economic development and community groups, and small internet providers for collecting local broadband service information.

- **Oct 17, 2019:** Sponsor introductory remarks on measure. (CR H8152)
- **Oct 14, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Communications and Technology.
- **Oct 11, 2019:** Introduced in House
- **Oct 11, 2019:** Referred to the Committee on Agriculture, and in addition to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
