Federal Information Resource to Strengthen Ties with State and Local Law Enforcement Act of 2019 or the FIRST State and Local Law Enforcement Act

This bill requires the Office for State and Local Law Enforcement within the Department of Homeland Security to report annually on its activities.

- **Nov 6, 2019:** Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs. Ordered to be reported with an amendment favorably.
- **Jan 29, 2019:** Mr. Thompson (MS) moved to suspend the rules and pass the bill.
- **Jan 29, 2019:** Considered under suspension of the rules. (consideration: CR H1256-1258)
- **Jan 29, 2019:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H.R. 495.
- **Jan 29, 2019:** Passed/agreed to in House: On motion to suspend the rules and pass the bill Agreed to by voice vote.(text: CR H1256)
