Fight Illicit Networks and Detect Trafficking Act or the FIND Trafficking Act

This bill directs the Government Accountability Office (GAO) to report on the use of virtual currencies and online marketplaces in sex and drug trafficking. The GAO must study topics including

- how illicit proceeds are transferred into the U.S. banking system,
- state and non-state actors that participate in such activity,
- preventative efforts from federal and state agencies, and
- the extent to which the unique characteristics of virtual currencies can contribute to the tracking and prosecution of illicit funding.

Actions Timeline

- **Jan 29, 2019:** Received in the Senate and Read twice and referred to the Committee on Banking, Housing, and Urban Affairs.
- **Jan 28, 2019:** Ms. Waters moved to suspend the rules and pass the bill.
- **Jan 28, 2019:** Considered under suspension of the rules. (consideration: CR H1223-1227)
- **Jan 28, 2019:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H.R. 502.
- **Jan 28, 2019:** At the conclusion of debate, the Yeas and Nays were demanded and ordered. Pursuant to the provisions of clause 8, rule XX, the Chair announced that further proceedings on the motion would be postponed.
- **Jan 28, 2019:** Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H1232-1233)
