Summary (as of Nov 13, 2019)

Medical Retiree Pay Restoration Act

This bill allows medically retired individuals who have less than 20 years of military service and are not eligible for combat-related special pay to concurrently receive full military retired pay and veterans' disability compensation.

Actions Timeline

- **Dec 2, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Disability Assistance and Memorial Affairs.
- **Nov 13, 2019:** Introduced in House
- **Nov 13, 2019:** Referred to the Committee on Armed Services, and in addition to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
