This bill bars the Supreme Court from citing for the purpose of precedence [*sic*] in all future cases the following Supreme Court decisions concerning the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act:

- *National Federation of Independent Business v. Sebelius*,
- *King v. Burwell*, and
- *Burwell v. Hobby Lobby Stores Inc.*
