Save Social Security Act of 2019

This bill modifies the requirements for Social Security payroll taxes and benefits to

- apply Social Security payroll taxes to annual income above \$300,000,
- include earnings above \$300,000 in the benefit formula, and
- increase to \$100,000 the income threshold above which a portion of a taxpayer's Social Security benefits is included in gross income.

(Under current law, Social Security payroll taxes apply to the first \$132,900 of income in 2019 and a portion of benefits is included in the gross income of individuals with certain income that exceeds thresholds of \$0, \$25,000, or \$32,000, depending on the individual's filing status.)

- **Mar 1, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Worker and Family Support.
- **Jan 15, 2019:** Introduced in House
- **Jan 15, 2019:** Referred to the House Committee on Ways and Means.
