Summary (as of Sep 30, 2020)

TSA Personnel Workplace Improvement Act of 2020

This bill revises personnel policies of the Transportation Security Administration (TSA).

Specifically, the TSA must ensure that its personnel (1) have adequate access to facilities designated for use by nursing mothers in the workplace, and (2) are provided at least 12 weeks of paid parental leave.

Actions Timeline

- **Oct 1, 2020:** Received in the Senate and Read twice and referred to the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation.
- **Sep 30, 2020:** Ms. Underwood moved to suspend the rules and pass the bill, as amended.
- **Sep 30, 2020:** Considered under suspension of the rules. (consideration: CR H5085-5086)
- **Sep 30, 2020:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H.R. 5811.
- **Sep 30, 2020:** Passed/agreed to in House: On motion to suspend the rules and pass the bill, as amended Agreed to by voice vote.
