Summary (as of May 15, 2020)

Airport Infrastructure Resources Security Act of 2020 or the AIR Security Act

This bill prohibits airport improvement project grant amounts from being used to enter into a contract for the procurement of infrastructure or equipment for a passenger boarding bridge at an airport with any entity that has violated the intellectual property rights of U.S. entities.

- **May 15, 2020:** Referred to the House Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure.
