Global Trade Accountability Act of 2019

This bill requires congressional approval of unilateral trade actions. Such actions may take effect without congressional approval for one 90-day period if the President

- determines that it is necessary because of a national emergency, because of an imminent threat to health or safety, for the enforcement of criminal laws, or for national security; and
- submits written notice of the determination to Congress.

Actions Timeline

- **Mar 1, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Trade.
- **Jan 23, 2019:** Introduced in House
- **Jan 23, 2019:** Sponsor introductory remarks on measure. (CR H1010-1011)
- **Jan 23, 2019:** Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means, and in addition to the Committee on Rules, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
