Promoting Fair and Effective Policing Through Research Act

This bill provides for the establishment of grants and programs to support research on the causes, consequences, and mitigation of police violence; develop standards for biometric identification systems and other advanced policing tools; test biometric identification technologies; and reduce the use of force by law enforcement officers.

Actions Timeline

- **Aug 1, 2020:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Cybersecurity, Infrastructure Protection, and Innovation.
- **Jun 18, 2020:** Introduced in House
- **Jun 18, 2020:** Sponsor introductory remarks on measure. (CR E545)
- **Jun 18, 2020:** Referred to the Committee on Science, Space, and Technology, and in addition to the Committees on Homeland Security, and the Judiciary, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
