Summary (as of Jul 1, 2020)

Revolving Loan Fund Flexibility Act of 2020

This bill authorizes a grantee that provides revolving loans using funds from a Department of Commerce economic development grant to transfer funds repaid from such a loan to another eligible project, subject to various requirements.

Actions Timeline

- **Jul 2, 2020:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Economic Development, Public Buildings, and Emergency Management.
- **Jul 1, 2020:** Introduced in House
- **Jul 1, 2020:** Referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, and in addition to the Committee on Financial Services, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
