Retaining Educators Takes Added Investment Now Act or the RETAIN Act

This bill allows a refundable tax credit for the employment of early childhood educators, teachers, early childhood education program directors, school leaders, and school-based mental health services providers that is based upon the number of school years for which such individuals have been continuously employed.

Actions Timeline

- **Jul 24, 2020:** Introduced in House
- **Jul 24, 2020:** Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means, and in addition to the Committee on Education and Labor, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
- **Jul 24, 2020:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Select Revenue Measures.
