Summary (as of Jan 24, 2019)

Education and Energy Act of 2019

This bill requires excess revenue from new mineral and geothermal leases to be provided to the counties in which the revenue is generated to supplement the education of students in kindergarten through grade 12 and to supplement public support of institutions of higher education. The bill applies to revenue from new leases that are in excess of the Congressional Budget Office's estimated revenue for the leases in the prior fiscal year.

Actions Timeline

- **Feb 12, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Energy and Mineral Resources.
- **Jan 24, 2019:** Introduced in House
- **Jan 24, 2019:** Referred to the Committee on Natural Resources, and in addition to the Committee on Education and Labor, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
