Summary (as of Jan 28, 2019)

This resolution expresses the sense of the House of Representatives that (1) government shutdowns cause substantial damage; (2) shutting down the government is not an acceptable tactic or strategy for resolving differences; and (3) Congress must ensure the continued, uninterrupted operations of the government and its duty to protect and promote the security of the American people.

Actions Timeline

- **Jan 30, 2019:** Mr. Clay moved to suspend the rules and agree to the resolution, as amended.
- **Jan 30, 2019:** Considered under suspension of the rules. (consideration: CR H1307-1313; text: CR H1307)
- **Jan 30, 2019:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H. Res. 79.
- **Jan 30, 2019:** At the conclusion of debate, the Yeas and Nays were demanded and ordered. Pursuant to the provisions of clause 8, rule XX, the Chair announced that further proceedings on the motion would be postponed.
