American High-Speed Rail Act

This bill addresses high-speed rail corridor development in the United States, including by providing additional funding for high-speed rail corridor planning, and developing comprehensive, performance-based safety regulations and standards for all high-speed rail projects.

Actions Timeline

- **Dec 10, 2020:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Railroads, Pipelines, and Hazardous Materials.
- **Dec 9, 2020:** Introduced in House
- **Dec 9, 2020:** Referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, and in addition to the Committee on Ways and Means, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
