Summary (as of Apr 6, 2022)

This resolution sets forth rules for consideration of H.Rept. 117-284 and an accompanying resolution offered by direction of the Select Committee to Investigate the January 6th Attack on the United States Capitol.

Actions Timeline

- **Apr 6, 2022:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H4216-4229)
- **Apr 6, 2022:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 1023.
- **Apr 6, 2022:** On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 219 - 206 (Roll no. 116). (consideration: CR H4228)
- **Apr 6, 2022:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 221 - 200 (Roll no. 117).(text: CR H4216)
- **Apr 6, 2022:** On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 221 - 200 (Roll no. 117). (text: CR H4216)
- **Apr 6, 2022:** Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
- **Apr 4, 2022:** Introduced in House
- **Apr 4, 2022:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 117-288, by Mr. Raskin.
- **Apr 4, 2022:** Provides that if House Report 117-152 is called up by direction of the Select Committee to Investigate the January 6th Attack on the United States Capitol, all points of order against the report are waived and the report shall be considered as read; an accompanying resolution offered by the direction of the Select Committee shall be considered as read and shall not be subject to a point of order. The previous question shall be considered as ordered on such resolution without intervening motion or demand for division of the question except one hour of debate.
- **Apr 4, 2022:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 72.
