## HRES 1037

Recommending that the House of Representatives find Peter K. Navarro and Daniel Scavino, Jr., in contempt of Congress for refusal to comply with subpoenas duly issued by the Select Committee to investigate the January 6th attack on the United States Capitol.

### Summary (as of Apr 6, 2022)

This resolution finds Peter K. Navarro and Daniel Scavino Jr. in contempt of Congress for failing to comply with congressional subpoenas. The resolution also directs the Speaker of the House to (1) certify the related reports from the Select Committee to Investigate the January 6th Attack on the United States Capitol to the United States Attorney's Office for the District of Columbia for criminal proceedings, and (2) take all other appropriate action to enforce the subpoenas.

## Actions Timeline

- **Apr 6, 2022:** Introduced in House
- **Apr 6, 2022:** By direction of the Select Committee to Investigate the January 6th Attack on the United States Capitol, Mr. Thompson (MS) called up H. Res. 1037 and asked for its immediate consideration.
- **Apr 6, 2022:** Considered under the provisions of rule H. Res. 1023. (consideration: CR H4371-4379)
- **Apr 6, 2022:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 1037.
- **Apr 6, 2022:** The previous question was ordered pursuant to the rule.
- **Apr 6, 2022:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 220 - 203 (Roll no. 118).(text: CR H4371)
