Summary (as of Feb 15, 2021)

Protecting Critical Infrastructure Act

This bill imposes an enhanced general penalty on any person who is sentenced to imprisonment for violating certain communications laws and who willfully or maliciously destroys any communications facility during and in relation to such violation.

Actions Timeline

- **Oct 1, 2021:** Executive Comment Received from Soil Conservation Service.
- **Oct 1, 2021:** Favorable Executive Comment Received from Travel and Tourism Admin.
- **Oct 1, 2021:** Unfavorable Executive Comment Received from Union Sta Redev Corp.
- **Apr 28, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Crime, Terrorism, and Homeland Security.
- **Feb 16, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Communications and Technology.
- **Feb 15, 2021:** Introduced in House
- **Feb 15, 2021:** Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on the Judiciary, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
