Providing for consideration of the bill (S. 3522) to provide enhanced authority for the President to enter into agreements with the Government of Ukraine to lend or lease defense articles to that Government to protect civilian populations in Ukraine from Russian military invasion, and for other purposes; and for other purposes.

This resolution provides for consideration of S. 3522 (temporarily waives certain requirements related to the President's authority to lend or lease defense articles if the defense articles are intended for Ukraine's government or the governments of other Eastern European countries affected by Russia's invasion of Ukraine).

The resolution adopts H. Res. 1035 (adjusts limitations on expenses for certain House committees).

The resolution extends through May 13, 2022, certain waivers of House rules included in H. Res. 188.

- **Apr 28, 2022:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 1065.
- **Apr 28, 2022:** WORDS TAKEN DOWN - During the course of debate, exception was taken to certain words used and a demand was made to have the words taken down. Mr. Raskin asked unanimous consent to withdraw the offending words. Agreed to without objection.
- **Apr 28, 2022:** DEBATE - The House resumed debate on H. Res. 1065.
