Summary (as of May 13, 2021)

Probation Officer Protection Act of 2021

This bill authorizes a probation officer to arrest a person other than the probationer without a warrant if there is probable cause to believe the person forcibly assaulted or obstructed a probation officer engaged in the performance of official duties.
