To prohibit the transfer of a firearm at a gun show by a person who is not a federally licensed firearms dealer.

### Summary (as of Jan 4, 2021)

This bill makes it unlawful for a person who is not a licensed gun dealer to transfer a firearm at a gun show.

The prohibition does not apply to a transfer to a licensed manufacturer, importer, dealer, or collector.

A violator is subject to criminal penalties—a fine, a prison term, or both.
