Rosie the Riveter National Historical Park Expansion Act

This bill adds Nystrom Elementary School to the Rosie the Riveter/World War II Home Front National Historical Park in California.

The Department of the Interior may also add certain other areas to the park. Such other areas must

- be determined to be eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places;
- have a direct connection to World War II home front themes in Richmond, California; and
- relate to the purpose, significance, and interpretive themes of the park.

Interior may enter into cooperative agreements with the West Contra Costa Unified School District and other appropriate public and private agencies, organizations, and institutions to carry out the purposes of this bill.

Interior shall coordinate visitor interpretation of the Nystrom Elementary School site with the West Contra Costa Unified School District.

- **Oct 18, 2022:** Committee on Energy and Natural Resources. Reported by Senator Manchin under authority of the order of the Senate of 10/14/2022 with an amendment in the nature of a substitute. With written report No. 117-180.
- **Oct 18, 2022:** Placed on Senate Legislative Calendar under General Orders. Calendar No. 531.
- **Jul 21, 2022:** Committee on Energy and Natural Resources. Ordered to be reported with an amendment in the nature of a substitute favorably.
- **May 11, 2022:** Committee on Energy and Natural Resources Subcommittee on National Parks. Hearings held.
- **May 19, 2021:** Introduced in Senate
