Bicycle Commuter Act of 2021

This bill modifies provisions relating to the tax exclusion for employer-provided fringe benefits for bicycle commuting. Specifically, the bill (1) repeals the suspension (for the period between 2018 and the end of 2025) of the exclusion, (2) includes *bikeshare* (a bicycle rental operation providing for pick up and drop off) and *low-speed electric bicycle* within the definition of *bicycle* for purposes of the exclusion, and (3) modifies the limitation on the exclusion to provide for a specified monthly limitation amount (i.e., 30% of the parking fringe benefit amount).
