Summary (as of Jan 5, 2021)

Big Cat Public Safety Act

This bill revises restrictions on the possession, exhibition, or breeding of big cats (i.e., species of lion, tiger, leopard, cheetah, jaguar, or cougar or any hybrid of such species). For example, the bill permits wildlife sanctuaries to allow direct contact between the public and big cats.

Actions Timeline

- **Feb 18, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Water, Oceans, and Wildlife.
- **Jan 5, 2021:** Introduced in House
- **Jan 5, 2021:** Referred to the Committee on Natural Resources, and in addition to the Committee on the Budget, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
