This bill terminates certain executive actions related to immigration.

Specifically, this bill terminates

- an executive order that directs the Bureau of the Census to include in a state's population count each individual whose usual place of residence is in that state, regardless of an individual's immigration status;
- an executive order that revokes another executive order that prioritized immigration enforcement against certain classes of aliens, such as aliens who have been charged with any criminal offense; and
- a presidential proclamation that ends the declared emergency pertaining to the U.S.-Mexico border and terminates the authorities used to redirect funds to construct a wall along that border.

Actions Timeline

- **Apr 2, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Border Security, Facilitation, and Operations.
- **Apr 1, 2021:** Introduced in House
- **Apr 1, 2021:** Referred to the Committee on Oversight and Reform, and in addition to the Committees on the Judiciary, Foreign Affairs, Armed Services, and Homeland Security, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
