Homegrown Act of 2021

This bill removes marijuana from the list of scheduled substances under the Controlled Substances Act and eliminates criminal penalties for an individual who manufactures, distributes, or possesses marijuana.

Additionally, the bill requires the Small Business Administration to establish the Equitable Licensing Grant Program. The purpose of the grant program is to support the implementation of cannabis licensing programs that minimize barriers to licensing and employment for individuals adversely impacted by the war on drugs.

Actions Timeline

- **Oct 19, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Crime, Terrorism, and Homeland Security.
- **Jun 15, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Conservation and Forestry.
- **Jun 9, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests, and Public Lands.
- **Apr 20, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Apr 19, 2021:** Introduced in House
- **Apr 19, 2021:** Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committees on the Judiciary, Agriculture, Natural Resources, and Small Business, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
