Ensuring Safe Capital Access for All Small Businesses Act of 2021

This bill removes cannabis from the schedule of controlled substances, and it prohibits the Small Business Administration from declining to provide certain small business financing to an eligible entity solely because it is a cannabis-related legitimate business or service provider.

Actions Timeline

- **Oct 19, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Crime, Terrorism, and Homeland Security.
- **Jun 15, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Conservation and Forestry.
- **Jun 11, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests, and Public Lands.
- **Apr 21, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Apr 20, 2021:** Introduced in House
- **Apr 20, 2021:** Referred to the Committee on Small Business, and in addition to the Committees on Energy and Commerce, the Judiciary, Natural Resources, and Agriculture, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
