Consortia-Led Energy and Advanced Manufacturing Networks Act

This bill requires the Department of Commerce to carry out a grant program for establishing consortia to enhance U.S. economic, environmental, and energy security by promoting domestic research and commercial application of clean technologies and advanced manufacturing processes. Clean technology means technologies, production processes, or methodologies that

- produce energy from renewable energy sources;
- transmit, distribute, or store energy more efficiently;
- enhance energy efficiency for buildings and industry;
- enable the development of a Smart Grid;
- produce an advanced or sustainable material with energy or energy efficiency applications;
- improve energy efficiency for transportation; or
- enhance water security through improved water management, conservation, distribution, or end use applications.

Actions Timeline

- **Apr 27, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Energy.
- **Apr 26, 2021:** Introduced in House
- **Apr 26, 2021:** Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on Science, Space, and Technology, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
