Childhood Offenders Rehabilitation and Safety Act of 2021

This bill limits the application of federal criminal law with respect to juvenile offenders, expands the publication of statistics related to juvenile offenders, and authorizes grants to support collaboration between state child-welfare and juvenile-justice agencies to address the needs of children who come into contact with both systems.

Actions Timeline

- **Nov 9, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Crime, Terrorism, and Homeland Security.
- **Apr 30, 2021:** Introduced in House
- **Apr 30, 2021:** Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, and in addition to the Committee on Ways and Means, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
- **Apr 30, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Apr 30, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Social Security.
