Jonny Wade Pediatric Cancer Research Act

This bill terminates (1) the taxpayer election to designate \$3 of income tax liability for financing of presidential election campaigns, (2) the Presidential Election Campaign Fund, and (3) the Presidential Primary Matching Payment Account.

The Department of the Treasury must transfer the funds remaining in the Presidential Election Campaign Fund to the 10-Year Pediatric Research Initiative Fund.

The National Institutes of Health (NIH) must prioritize certain pediatric research that does not replicate existing NIH research activities.

Actions Timeline

- **May 10, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **May 7, 2021:** Introduced in House
- **May 7, 2021:** Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means, and in addition to the Committees on Energy and Commerce, and House Administration, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
