Biking on Long-Distance Trails Act

This bill establishes requirements related to long-distance bike trails.

The Department of the Interior and the Department of Agriculture shall

- identify not fewer than 10 long-distance bike trails;
- identify not fewer than 10 areas in which there is an opportunity to develop or complete long-distance bike trails;
and
- coordinate with stakeholders on the feasibility of, and identifying any resources necessary for, completing the development of such trails.
