No Land Grab Act of 2021

This bill prohibits from having the force and effect of law a provision of Executive Order 14008 (86 Fed. Reg. 7619), titled *Tackling the Climate Crisis at Home and Abroad*, that requires the Department of the Interior to recommend steps to achieve the goal of conserving at least 30% of U.S. lands and waters by 2030.

Actions Timeline

- **Jul 1, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Conservation and Forestry.
- **May 18, 2021:** Introduced in House
- **May 18, 2021:** Referred to the Committee on Natural Resources, and in addition to the Committees on Agriculture, and Science, Space, and Technology, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
