Summary (as of Jan 10, 2022)

Prohibiting IRS Financial Surveillance Act

This bill prohibits the Department of the Treasury from requiring a financial institution to report the balances, transactions, or the transfers into and out of a financial account. This prohibition does not apply to laws or regulations in effect on the date of enactment.
