Summary (as of May 28, 2021)

United States-Mexico Electricity Exchange Act

This bill requires the Department of Energy to work with the appropriate representatives of the government of Mexico to establish a United States-Mexico Electricity Exchange Initiative that promotes the interconnection of electric transmission facilities between the U.S. southern border states and Mexico.

Actions Timeline

- **May 31, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Energy.
- **May 28, 2021:** Introduced in House
- **May 28, 2021:** Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on Foreign Affairs, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
