Summary (as of May 28, 2021)

Fully Informed Veteran Act of 2021

This bill requires the Department of Veterans Affairs to authorize physicians and other health care providers of the Veterans Health Administration to provide veterans with information about participating in state-approved marijuana programs if their state has such a program available. Under the bill, the term *state* includes the District of Columbia, federally recognized tribes, and U.S. territories and possessions.

Actions Timeline

- **Nov 1, 2022:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Crime, Terrorism, and Homeland Security.
- **Sep 7, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **May 31, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **May 28, 2021:** Introduced in House
- **May 28, 2021:** Referred to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs, and in addition to the Committees on the Judiciary, and Energy and Commerce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
