Summary (as of Jun 4, 2021)

Protecting Infrastructure and Promoting the Economy Act or the PIPE Act

This bill directs the Environmental Protection Agency to establish (1) a wastewater infrastructure discretionary grant program, and (2) a drinking water infrastructure discretionary grant program. Under the programs, state, local, and tribal governments, public water utilities (e.g., systems used to treat wastewater or sewage), and certain water systems may apply for grants for infrastructure projects.

- **Jun 7, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Environment and Climate Change.
- **Jun 4, 2021:** Introduced in House
- **Jun 4, 2021:** Referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, and in addition to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
