Pennsylvania National Heritage Areas Reauthorization Act

This bill reauthorizes in Pennsylvania through FY2036

- the Rivers of Steel National Heritage Area,
- the Lackawanna Valley National Heritage Area,
- the Delaware and Lehigh National Heritage Corridor,
- the Schuylkill River Valley National Heritage Area, and
- the Oil Region National Heritage Area.

The bill eliminates the limitation on the total amount that may be appropriated for

- the Rivers of Steel National Heritage Area,
- the Lackawanna Valley National Heritage Area,
- the Schuylkill River Valley National Heritage Area, and
- the Oil Region National Heritage Area.

Actions Timeline

- **Oct 6, 2021:** Committee on Energy and Natural Resources Subcommittee on National Parks. Hearings held.
- **Feb 23, 2021:** Introduced in Senate
- **Feb 23, 2021:** Read twice and referred to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources.
