**Labor, Health and Human Services, Education, Agriculture, Rural Development, Energy and Water Development, Financial Services and General Government, Interior, Environment, Military Construction, Veterans Affairs, Transportation, and Housing and Urban Development Appropriations Act, 2022**

This bill provides FY2022 appropriations for several federal departments and agencies.

It includes 7 of the 12 regular FY2022 appropriations bills:

- the Departments of Labor, Health and Human Services, and Education, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2022;
- the Agriculture, Rural Development, Food and Drug Administration, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2022;
- the Energy and Water Development and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2022;
- the Financial Services and General Government Appropriations Act, 2022;
- the Department of the Interior, Environment, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2022;
- the Military Construction, Veterans Affairs, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2022; and
- the Transportation, Housing and Urban Development, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2022.

The departments, agencies, and activities funded in the bill include

- the Forest Service,
- Department of Defense military construction and family housing activities,

- several related and independent agencies.
