Extension of Authority to Acquire Innovative Commercial Items Act of 2022

This bill extends the pilot program for authority to acquire innovative commercial items using general solicitation procedures through FY2027.

The bill raises the maximum value of a contract under the program from \$10 million to \$25 million.
