Summary (as of Jul 29, 2021)

Safe Stay Act

This bill requires places of public accommodation to install compliant carbon monoxide detectors within each sleeping or dwelling unit. Further, during check-in, such accommodations must provide each guest with written notice of compliance with the requirement.

Actions Timeline

- **Jul 30, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Consumer Protection and Commerce.
- **Jul 29, 2021:** Introduced in House
- **Jul 29, 2021:** Referred to the Committee on Science, Space, and Technology, and in addition to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
- **Jul 29, 2021:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Research and Technology.
